Start	□ Play a treasure hunt. Set boundaries: find the hidden treasure within		
Discuss	 [Prepare in advance illustrate, an old, dirty and, preferably chipped/cracked, clay/ ceramic pot. Hide inside it some 'treasure'/ treats.] Imagine, whilst out 'metal detectoring', you get a clear signal. Something is hidden beneath your feet. What do you do? How do you feel? Imagine you dig up a big lump of earth. You wipe off the bulk of mud. It's this clay pot. What do you see? It's chipped/cracked/ dirty. How do you feel now? If this pot could speak, what could it tell you? Imagine you are about to throw it back, when you think to look inside. You discover it contains treasure. Now what are you thinking? Doing? Feeling?

P Explore	 v.7 How are WE like a clay pot? How does life sometimes chip/crack US? Our physical scars tell a story: yes, about tough times, but ultimately about our <i>survival</i>. What, if any, physical scars do you have? What's the story? Why can a chipped/ cracked pot still be so valuable? What connects this clay pot, us, and <u>Genesis 2:7</u>? Jeremiah 18:1-6 Why is a clay pot's value, even if it's chipped/ cracked, affected by a) who made it? b) if it's an original or a mass-produced copy? 		
	 What does that say about us, even if we've been chipped/ cracked by life? v.7 Look beyond the chipped/cracked outward appearance; look inside. What do we contain inside us? Where does it come from? What does it give us? v.8-9 What does it mean to feel hard-pressed? Perplexed? Persecuted? truck-down? Have these ever been your story? If the treasure within is from another Kingdom, the Kingdom of Heaven, how does it help us deal with whatever life throws at us? v.10 How was Jesus hard-pressed? Perplexed? Persecuted? truck-down? Whot for? What came after Jesus' death? v.11 How does carrying Jesus inside, help us/you deal with life? 		
Go further	Jeremiah 18:1-6 What does it mean to accept we are like clay in the Potter's hands? What is required for the Potter to be able to mould and even re-mould the clay? Why are we sometimes less interested in the re-moulding?		

Reflect	 Which one verse stands out to you? Why do you think it grabs your attention? Which verse(s) will you need to think more about? Why? James 1:5 Where in your life do you need more Wisdom? 	
Do	 Have a go at making some <u>kintsugi art</u>. Find out about the work of <u>KintsugiHope.com</u>. Consider running a Kingsugi Hope <u>well-being group</u>.
