How do we echo this with our small groups? What difference does being part of a small group make to your experience of church life and your faith journey?</li> <li>□ v. 9: What was the effect of hearing the scriptures read aloud? Why do you think they responded in this way?</li> <li>□ v.10-12: How does Ezra encourage the community to respond? Why do you think this was?</li> <li>□ v.13-17: How does Ezra remind the returners that God made them to be pioneers, not settlers? How is the tabernacle symbolic of the Israelites' purpose as a movement, not a monument? How could this be true for us as a church? And in our personal faith journeys?</li> <li>□ v.18: What is the focus and the purpose of the gathering? How can we anchor our return to the church building on the real purpose of our church: Jesus?</li> </ul>
