	10-12-2024		Advent – Who do you think you are?
Start	<ul> <li>Who do you think you are?</li> <li>Play a game of <i>Who Am I</i>? Players ask one another yes/no questions to try to guess the identity of the mystery personality/ historical figure whose name has been written on Post-It notes and stuck to their foreheads.</li> </ul>		
Discuss	<ul> <li>Have you ever researched your 'family tree'? What did you discover?</li> <li>Why can it be so painful for some?</li> <li>To what extent does our past/ ancestry predetermine our present &amp; future?</li> </ul>		
Read	<u>Matthew 1:1-17</u>	J Listen again	ChesterRoadBaptist.org.uk/Watch
Explore	<ul> <li>Why do we often start teaching Matthew at verse 18, skipping the genealogy?</li> <li>Does it matter that Matthew's genealogy differs slightly to Luke 3 and 1</li> <li>Chronicles 1-3? What was Matthew's higher purpose?</li> <li>What was Matthew signalling by including 5 women in this genealogy?</li> <li>Today, when the 4 Old Testament women are highlighted, why is it usually as 'sinners'? Why are the 'sinner' men not given the same treatment?</li> <li>v.3: Who was Tamar? Genesis 38. How was she forced into this situation just to survive? What had her extended family &amp; community <i>not</i> done? Why is Judah [<i>m</i>] not labelled in the same way as Tamar [<i>f</i>]?</li> <li>v.5: Who was Rahab? Joshua 2. What circumstances might lead someone to 'choose' to become a sex worker? How did she, a 'Canaanite', show great courage and faith in protecting these Jewish male 'strangers'? See Hebrews 11:31.</li> <li>v.5: Who was Ruth? Is it significant that she, like Rahab was from a different religion?</li> <li>v.6: Who was Bathsheba? <u>2 Samuel 11</u> Why have historians &amp; theologians labelled her an 'adulteress', but King David not an 'adulterer'? What part did <i>#MeToo</i> power and exploitation play in this sexual relationship? Why aren't <i>men</i> in the genealogy called out for <i>their</i> sexual sin? Why are <i>women</i> so often shamed – and still today?</li> <li>v.16: Why might Matthew have included the 4 other women to prepare people for Mary? Why was Mary shamed? See v.18-19.</li> </ul>		
Go further	<ul> <li>□ How does Jesus deal with shame?</li> <li>□ See <u>Hebrews 12:1-3</u> and <u>John 8:1-11</u>.</li> </ul>		
Reflect	<ul> <li>Which one verse stands out to you? Why do you think it grabs your attention?</li> <li>Which verse(s) will you need to think more about? Why?</li> </ul>		

Do	<ul> <li>Research your 'family tree'.</li> <li>Invite someone to a Christmas event/ service at Chester Road Baptist Church.</li> </ul>
