How do <i>you</i> feel about <i>belonging</i> to God? What difference does that make? v.9: Who was Jesus praying for? See also Romans 8:34 & Hebrews 7:25. How does it feel to know <i>Christ</i> is praying for <i>you</i>? What might Christ be praying for you? What does it mean to 'pray in the spirit'? Why is Jesus <i>not</i> praying generically for 'the world' but rather for specific people in specific situations? How might that guide our/ your praying for those around/ near to us/you? v.11: What does Jesus mean by 'the world'? What does Jesus want 'Holy Father' to do for His followers? Why not simply <i>remove</i> them from difficulties/ challenges? v.13: Is 'joy' possible during trial/ suffering? How? What's the measure? When have you experienced surprising joy, despite circumstances? v.17: Is 'truth' more than just what Jesus taught? See John 14:6: What does it mean that Jesus IS Truth? What is the 'word'? The Greek 'word' here is 'Logos'. See John 1:1: Jesus is the Logos, THE Word. What's the relationship between Jesus and the Bible? The Bible <i>contains</i> the word of God, Jesus /S the Word of God. To what extent do you agree/ disagree with this statement? 		
Go further	□ <u>v.15</u> : In the Lord's Prayer, what did Jesus teach us to pray? If Jesus taught us, 'deliver us from evil' should modern Bible translators add in 'evil one'? Compare with KJV. Does describing evil as a character/ person/ personality: a) underestimate/ disguise the impact/ seriousness of evil – so we don't take it seriously enough? b) overinflate the power/ credibility of evil – so we take it too seriously? If evil is the opposite/ antithesis of God, and three-in-one God is personality/ knowable, then evil cannot be a person/ personality. To what extent do you agree/ disagree with this statement?
