



Small Group/ Reflection Notes

	22-09-2024 In God's Name
Start	 Play a game of Holy Sevens. As a group, in turn, number off 1, 2, 3, each person saying the next number. The challenge is to substitute any number with a '7' or multiple of '7' with "Holy" e.g. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, "Holy", 8 13, "Holy", 15, 16, "Holy", 18, 19, 20, "Holy", 22
Discuss	 What does your name mean? Why do we each have a name? How would you feel if you didn't have a name? Why do some think it OK to use God's Name as a profanity? Does God need us to defend <i>Them</i> (Father, Son & Holy Spirit)? "People behave worse when they think they're defending God." What does it mean to misuse God's Name?
Read	Exodus 20:1-7 Listen again ChesterRoadBaptist.org.uk/Watch
P Explore	 v.7: Why is this, the 3rd, often thought the most simple of the 10? When have you felt in the presence of Holiness? How did you respond? Why might the Hebrews/ Israelites have thought God's Name too holy to say/ write? God's Name was/is the core of who God is, what God is like, how God acts, everything that <i>is</i> God – all encapsulated perfectly and completely in one Name – <i>Yahweh/ God</i>. Do we misuse God's Name if we become too familiar with the Divine? Contemporary worship often reasserts the truth of our closeness, intimacy with God (based on e.g. John 15:15). Has the pendulum swung too far? How do we maintain <i>both</i> intimacy/ friendship with God <i>and</i> awe/ reverence for God. What happens when we major on one, ignoring the other? If God is Love, what does it mean to 'fear the Lord'? What's the difference between <i>scared</i> intimidating fear and <i>sacred</i> holy fear? Do we misuse God's name if we suggest God is something <i>They</i> (Father, Son & Holy Spirit) aren't? For example, some emphasis <u>1 John 4:8</u> God is Love (acceptance), others <u>1 John 1:5</u> God is Light (holiness). Why is it both/and, not either/or? How does our/ your church tradition, upbringing, culture, personality type all influence what we/you believe God is like and does? Where do we get our theology from? Why do 'memes', worship song lyrics, catchy slogans, social media posts etc. sometimes give us an incomplete misunderstanding of God? "If, coincidentally, God always seems to agree with you, think like you, vote like you, feel comfortable with those you feel comfortable with, you've probably missed something about God." Do you agree? Why?

	 Do we misuse God's Name if we use it to justify or promote our own desires, prejudices, ambitions, wants etc? How? e.g. God has called me to be God wants me to have God says they are all John 16:23-24: Why do we pray 'in the <i>NAME</i> of Jesus'? Are we asking Jesus to yield to what <i>we</i> want or for us to yield to what <i>Jesus</i> wants? How do we discern the difference? How do we pray in line with the nature/ Name of God? Matthew 5:33-37: Instead of misusing God's Name, how can we 'own' our own desires, prejudices, ambitions, wants? v.7: What turns this, the 3rd, from being a command into a promise? You shall not misuse/ manipulate the name of the Lord; you won't need to, because I'm giving you authority to pray with and in the Spirit.
Go further	Instead of using God's Name, the Hebrews/ Israelites came up with lots of different <i>titles</i> for God, e.g. Creator, Healer, King of Kings How many more can you identify? Which one feels most significant for you right now?
Reflect	 Which one verse stands out to you? Why do you think it grabs your attention? Which verse(s) will you need to think more about? Why? Meditate on, "Blessed be Your Name"
Do Do	□ Research the origins of your name.
Pray	Say aloud and repeat slowly, over and over: <i>Blessed be your Name.</i>
