What might that involve? What could/ does Sabbath look like for you?</li> <li>□ v.9: How are 'work' and 'rest' linked? What happens when they become out of balance? [e.g. The few hoard all the work, leading to stress, unemployment?] How often do you hear Christians boasting about their adultery or stealing? So why do we boast about how little time we take off/ how hard we work?</li> <li>□ v.10: Who is 'Sabbath' for? Why is Sabbath more than just "do no work"? If Sabbath rest is "to the Lord", what can this free us/ you from? Why was the introduction of Sabbath so radically inclusive - for all? Justice, not just us! [e.g. age, gender, socio-economic status, ethnicity] How do we ensure everyone benefits from Sabbath? [e.g. employment rights, how we pay self-employed tradespeople] Why is Sabbath also good for the environment, farming?</li> <li>□ v.11: If God is all-powerful Creator, why did God rest? Genesis 2:2 What does this say about 'rest'? What does this say to us about Sabbath rest? Why does Deuteronomy 5:12-15 set Sabbath as the antidote to exploitation and oppression? Why is this necessary today?</li> <li>□ Mark 2:23-28: What did the Pharisee accuse Jesus and His disciples of? How did Jesus respond to the Pharisees? v.27: What happens when Sabbath becomes a promise, not a command; a gift, not an obligation? When is your Sabbath?
