Go further	The legacy of slavery - reparations To end slavery, in 1833 the British Government compensated the Slave OWNERS £20 million financed by a long-term loan (equivalent today of £17 billion; back then it was 40% of the total Government Budget or 5% of GDP.) This debt was finally paid in 2015 – just 9 years ago. Owners used it to purchase country estates that we today visit on our days out; build up huge investment funds		

	No compensation was ever paid to the millions of people who were enslaved: taken against their will, transported in chains from West & Central Africa to the Caribbean & USA, and forced to work on plantations, controlled by the British State and Missionary Organisations.
	Then we pulled out, made ourselves look like the good guys by telling everyone we ended slavery, and left millions of people destitute and whole nations lacking in infrastructure, education
	We all know how evil the Holocaust was: millions of Jews, as well as Gypsies, the disabled, LGBTQ+, religious minorities were exterminated. You only do that when you convince yourself that these are less than people – less than us.
	Imagine if the Holocaust camp guards all withdrew, the gates were unlocked and the survivors were released from their chains, only for them to discover:
	 Compensation was being paid to the guards/ Nazi regime for 'their loss' Little or nothing was being done to help survivors rebuild their lives/ nations
	This is what we collectively as Britain did.
	None of us today were alive then, we didn't make the decisions. But we have all continued to benefit financially from it, we've all had a share in the prosperity e.g. education, higher standards of living, inheritances, properties, pensions
	It's no coincidence that the salve-owning nations (Britain, USA, Spain France, the Netherlands) have all prospered, whilst Caribbean nations and, far more so, African nations, have struggled.
	When someone is found to have stolen what belongs to others, we expect them to apologise and to pay it back. We call that justice.
	Matthew 5:23-26: Does this apply only to individuals? Can it apply to nations too? What, if anything, does this have to say about reparations for Colonial slavery?
	Luke 19:1-10: What had Zaccheus been doing? Why do Empires do this? How had this oppressed so many? What happened to open Zaccheus' eyes to oppression? Could he just have issued a 'statement of regret' or even apologised? Instead, what did Zaccheus commit to doing? What, if anything, does this have to say about reparations for Colonial slavery?
Reflect	 Which one verse stands out to you? Why do you think it grabs your attention? Which verse(s) will you need to think more about? Why? What one thing will you do differently?
