	10-11-2024	10:9 – You shall not give false testimony against your neighbour
Start	☐ Play a game of Would I lie to you? (BBC comedy panel show.) Invite a participant to make a brief statement that begins, "I once" This can be either TRUE or a LIE. The other participants then each ask one question to help them decide if the statement is TRUE or a LIE.	
Discuss	 □ Is there such thing as 'truth'? When is "my truth" helpful? Unhelpful? □ When might you have been lied to this week? □ When have you been tempted to lie this week? □ Is it ever OK, even necessary, to lie? When? Why? □ What are white lies? Give examples e.g. 'I like what you're wearing'; 'I'm praying for you'. Why are they called white lies? What does that say about 'whiteness' (the presumption that to be white is the norm/ standard by which all others are judged)?

Explore	□ v.16: Why is truth/ trust so important when living alongside others (community)? Why would his have been especially true for those, like the Israelites, fleeing from an oppressive regime and wandering in the desert in search of safety? □ Deuteronomy 19:16-19: How were some manipulating the Courts to 'get rid' of those they disliked/ were in dispute with? What could false accusations/ false testimony do? Given the range of Old Testament 'offences' that carried the death penalty (see below), how was this better than murder? Pick at random one or two of the references below: how could false testimony get someone executed? When has 'false testimony' led to wrong convictions in UK Courts? e.g. 'Birmingham Six', Post Office Horizon scandal, 'Stockwell Six' 'Oval Four' What were/ are the consequences for those wrongly convicted? □ John 14:6: What does Jesus claim to be? What does it mean to be the Truth? □ John 8:32: What does it mean to know the truth? Is this about knowing knowledge/ doctrines/ beliefs or is it about knowing Jesus, the Truth? How does this set us free? From what? For what? □ Numbers 23:19: How does God differ to humans? How? Why? □ Hebrews 6:18: Why is it impossible for God to lie? □ Ephesians 4:15: What does it mean to speak the truth in love? What happens when we prioritise truth? What makes it authenticallyin love? □ Ephesians 4:25: What are we to do? Why? When have you experienced this? □ Matthew 5:33-37: Why do some say, "I swear on my"? Does it make them sound more or less believable? Why does Jesus encourage us to be more confident in our own "yes" or "no" responses? Why not rely on the testimony/ authority of others to validate what we say?
