Explore	 □ v.28: If the question was just about 'the 10', which one do <u>you</u> think is the most important? If the question was more about the wider Law (Jewish tradition says, in all, there are 613 laws/ commands in the Torah), which one would you say? □ v.29: Why did none of 'the 10' make it into Jesus' answer? How might Jesus' questioner/ hearers have reacted to His answer? □ v.29: Why did Jesus instead answer with the Shema Prayer? Do you have a default prayer (freestyle or set) you regularly pray? Deuteronomy 6:4: What might Jesus' hearers have needed to know from this about Him and His mission? What does it mean for God to be <i>Lord</i>? What does it mean for God to be 'One'? Why did Jesus want to start from Oneness (unity/ coherence within, essence of) God? i.e. as God understands Godself? □ v.30: Why is love the most important command? 1 John 4:8: What is the essence of God? In light of v.29's 'Oneness', why is 'love God, love others, love yourself' the natural response to God? How are we to love God? With what? How does God love us? □ v.30: Read Deuteronomy 6:5: Why does Jesus add-in 'mind'? How do you love God with all your 'mind'? How can questioning, challenging, investigating, even doubt, be an aid to deeper faith? What happens to our or other people's faith when we close our minds to difficult/ complex life issues? □ v.31: Why does authentic love for God lead to/ demand 'love others'? Who are our 'neighbours'? Why do we not get to choose who are 'neighbours' are? Leviticus 19:18: How can our own attitudes/ prejudices affect who we treat as 'neighbours'? □ v.31: Why does authentic love for God lead to/ demand 'love yourself'? Why is it "love your neighbour as you love yourself"? What's the link/ relationship? 		

	 □ v.32-33: Why is 'love God, love others, love yourself' the essence of the Law? Why does this trump the minutia of the Law? To what extent does it feel that 'love God, love others, love self' wins over religious traditions/ institutional structures? □ v.34: What journey was this 'pillar of religious orthodoxy' on? Why was he beginning to get it, but others not? What did he still need to do?
